

ORDINANCE NO. F-1778

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WHEATON LIQUOR CONTROL  
ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 6 - ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES - CLASS O LICENSE

WHEREAS, The City of Wheaton, Illinois (“City”) is an Illinois home rule municipality pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution, 1970, and as such the City may exercise any power or perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined it to be in the best interests of the City and its residents to consider certain amendments to the Wheaton Liquor Control Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Wheaton, DuPage County, Illinois, pursuant to its home rule powers, as follows:


Section 1: That Sec. 6-87, subsection (18) is hereby repealed and rescinded in its entirety and replaced with a new Section 6-87 subsection (18) which shall read as follows:

*“Class O license shall authorize the manufacture of beer, only at a designated premises, for the sole purpose of the retail sale, consumption and storage of such beer only at and within such premises.*


- a. A class O license shall only be available as a supplemental license for premises holding a class I or M license.
- b. All such supplemental licenses shall be granted only upon a showing by the applicant that all applicable federal and state tax stamps have been procured.“

Section 2: All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with these provisions are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner prescribed by law.
